Tips for Serving

1. Arrive 20 minutes early.

5. Keep your hand in "praying hands" while standing. And on your knees while sitting.
6. Stay alert and think about the next thing you must do.
7. Remember to line up correctly: candlebearer, server, lecturer, Father, deacon, server then candlebearer.
8. Let the Priest go to his place before you go to yours on the Altar.
9. Remember you are serving God. I am there to help you. So if in doubt, look at me and I will tell you what to do.

10. Relax, you are all wonderful people and do a great job helping our Parish. Staying relaxed will help you to remember the next thing.
11. Help each other to remember your duties and gently remind someone when they need help. For example, reminding the Book server to lay book on the Altar before coming to receive the gifts.
12. Lastly, if you have a conflict and cannot server on a day for which you were scheduled, please find someone to trade with. This is your responsibility (not your parents).
